# **Biofuel Park, Tinthani**



The project entitled "Establishment of Bio-fuel Park at Tinthini in Yadagiri District of Karnataka" was initiated on during 2012-13 working under UAS, Raichur covering an area of 42 acres of land. This is situated on the banks of river Krishna from where the irrigation facility was created by layout of pipe lines. The project was initiated with the funding assistance of Karnataka State Bio-energy development board, Bangalore and in collaboration with the University of Agricultural Sciences.

For the establishment of the project and for smooth and effective running and achievement of the above objectives a budget outlay of Rs. 591 lakhs was submitted to KSBDB, Bangalore of which Rs. 296 lakhs was sanctioned.

Promotion of bio-fuel species like pongamia, neem, Simarouba etc were planted in 32 acres of bio-fuel park and they are in productive stage. Seeds and seedling produced on farm were distributed to farmers on free of cost. Totally 50,000 seedlings were distributed among the farmers, school premises and kitchen garden. Seedlings were also issued to the forestry department for road side planting. The survival rate of 70-80 per cent was initially recorded. Further the gap was filled and growth is satisfactory. These plants are started flow ering and bearing fruits.



Presently about 4000 bio-fuel plants are well survived in the bio-fuel park and they are expected to produce economic yield in two years.

The condition of the seedling in farmers field is satisfactory and about 60-70 per cent survival has been recorded. The plants are expected to yield in 3-4 years.

Presently pongamia seeds are procured from farmers @ Rs32/kg thus creating awareness among

the farmers.

- 1. The processing of oil has been imitated and demonstrated its use as tractor fuels and lightening house hold lamps. The programme will be expanded to panchayath / hobli level in due course i.e. after increase in production.
- Utilization of bio-fuel seeds for various value added products like seed cake has been demonstrated.
- 3. Awareness regarding the Self Employm ent generation and increased subsidiary income for the farmers has been given through trainings ( on campus and off campus), distribution of literatures, exhibitions etc. On date 177 training programmes were given to benefit 32821 farmers/students/NGOs/ agriculture departments/ CADA. About 19 exhibitions were . organized across the state which benefitted 611207 visitors.

- Promotion of bio-fuel species like pongamia, neem, simarouba etc were planted in 35.5 acres of bio-fuel park and they are in productive stage. Seeds and seedling produced on farm were distributed to farmers on free of cost. Totally 50,000 seedlings were distributed among the farmers, school premises and kitchen garden. Seedlings were also issued to the forestry department for road side planting. The survival rate of 70-80 per cent was initially recorded. Further the gap was filled and growth is satisfactory. These plants are started flowering and bearing fruits.
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- Three International Biofuel Days were celebrated on 10-08-2015, 10-08-2016 and 10-08-2017 at Biofuel Park, Tinthani, Santhekellur and Biofuel Park, Tinthani respectively, over 1500 seedlings were planted during on this occasion. B.Sc. Agri students, high school students and farmers were participated and gained knowledge on importance of bio-fuel production.
- To disseminate bio-fuel information **177** trainings and awareness programme being organized, **32821** people were benefitted.
- Thirteen (13) exhibitions were organized at Ankalimath Jatramahotsava, Ankalimath, Krishibagya programme at Koppal and Krishimela, UAS, Dharwad, UAHS, Shivamogga, UHS, Bagalkot, UAS, Raichur, Jatramahotsava, Santhekellur and Bhailhongal. Around 611207 farmers and students were get sensitized about benefit of bio-fuel. During exhibition at Koppal, Shri Krishna Bhyregowda, Agriculture Minister visited our stall and interacted with staff about the bio-fuel activities.
- Biofuel related posters; technical bulletins were prepared for diffusion of technologies.
- **25** bio-fuel based **SHG**s were formed.
- Supplied bio-fuel seeds for planting around Yadgir district by making soil ball which was organized by **Pollution Control Board** and DC office, Yadgiri.
- During 2015-16, on the occasion of Deepavali festival, Bio-fuel Mahiti Andola was organised at UAS, Raichur main campus, College of Agriculture, B. Gudi and College of Agriculture, Kalaburagi. Pongamia oil was distributed for lightening of lamp during the festival.
- **Field activities**: To enhance productivity of Biofuel Park, inter crops like transplanted pigeonpea, drill sown pigeonpea, groundnut, mesta, foxtail millet, castor were introduced.

• **Fifty five thousand four hudnred** biofuel seedlings were produced and planted in farmer's fields and school premises. There was 60 per cent establishement of seedlings in farmers field and school premises.

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
